

What is a Cookie?

A cookie is a small text file that stores internet settings. A cookie only contains text, it is not a program and it does not contain virus. Almost every website uses cookie technology. This applies to ens.dk too.

The use of cookies on this website, ens.dk

Ens.dk uses first-party and third-party cookies to:

- Enable features without which you would not be able to use the website as intended, also known as 'strictly necessary' cookies, e.g. cookies that are used to see if a user is logged in
- Make social media content (Twitter and LinkedIn) available to the users
- Generate data for the purpose of statistics

Statistics cookies make possible the generation of data that gives insight into e.g. how the users navigate and which content is viewed. This information is used to optimize contents and the site's structure.

The data we use for statistical purposes is anonymized. This means that we are not able to identify you as a person in the processing of the data.

How to avoid or delete a cookie?

Most browsers accept cookies by default. You can alter your browser settings to not accept cookies or delete the cookies from your computer. Different web browsers may use different methods for managing cookies.
